CRISIS RESPONSE FLIGHT TEAM TRAINING IN CIU 10

With the continued importance of school safety issues, and the need to be prepared to respond to and support our schools following a critical incident, CIU 10 hosted a region-wide three day training

in June conducted by nationally known speaker, Cheri Lovre, from Crisis Management Institute in Oregon. Ms. Lovre has extensive experience in responding to critical incidents in schools. Over 100 school personnel including administrators, counselors, school psychologists and school resource officers attended the training. The focus was preparedness on supporting a school and community after a critical incident event. As a result of the training, seven "flight teams" were created which consist of educators from different districts and areas of certification. Should a critical incident occur, a school superintendent could request that a flight team respond to the district and provide support. CIU 10 also has a team trained. There was such a positive response to the training that Ms. Lovre will return in mid-November to train another 80 educators.

CIU 10 PARTNERS WITH PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR COVID 19 TESTING SITE IN CENTRE COUNTY

The CIU 10 was asked by the Pennsylvania Association of Intermediate Units (PAIU) and the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DoH) to host a testing center to ensure free COVID-19 testing is available to families of school children and the broader community. The focus area of this testing site was in Centre county to replace the location that was in Bellefonte. The site opened on Tuesday, September 13, 2022. Testing in Centre County will be available Tuesday through Saturday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. through 7/31/23 in the parking lot in front of the building located at 60 Decibel Road, State College, PA 16801. The testing center is being staffed by AMI Expeditionary Health Care

CIU 10 GETS NEW LOGO

Over the past year, CIU 10 has developed a new Comprehensive Plan, which included a new mission and vision statement as well as a new logo. In the fall of 2021, CIU 10 embarked on a process to have students from the Clearfield County Career and Technology Center, Central Pennsylvania Institute of Science and Technology and the Keystone Central School District, submit an entry for our new logo. To create an authentic learning experience, students interacted with a small team of CIU

10 employees throughout the process to learn about the organization and work through the design process. Each team submitted a final design and



TRAUMA SKILLED COLLABORATIVE NETWORK

CIU 10, in partnership with Appalachia Intermediate Unit 8 and the National DropOut Prevention Center, hosted training for teams of educators from six districts within our three county region. With a continued focus on addressing and supporting the needs of students within our schools, this train-the-trainer model will empower district teams to return to their schools and provide training for all staff. A team of educators from CIU 10 also participated in the training to provide technical support and assistance to our schools via monthly networking meetings and on site support as requested by districts.
