Regional Trauma-Skilled Schools Collaborative Network

Beginning in Fall 2022, CIU 10 partnered with IU 8 and the National Dropout Prevention Center to establish Trauma Skilled Schools in which Catalyst Action Teams (CAT) were developed to lead their districts in a Tier 1 program that moves educators beyond "traumainformed" plans to "trauma-skilled" practices. CIU 10 currently has eight districts and one charter school participating in this network with over 65 CAT members trained in the Trauma-Skilled Model. In addition to the Trauma-Skilled Model trainings, CAT members have the opportunity to meet monthly with other teams to gain a deeper understanding of concepts, sharing experiences, challenges, and insights.

Through this collaborative network, educators are empowered to integrate trauma-informed strategies into classrooms, creating safe spaces for students to learn and thrive. Fostering a supportive and nurturing environment is essential for the success of both students and educators, an approach designed to enhance the well-being of our educational communities. One key component is infusing opportunities for emotional regulation (Purposeful Practices) by implementing Trauma-Skilled initiatives throughout school routines as well as supporting the development of student resilience that focus on student connection, belonging, achievement, autonomy, and fulfillment.

We will work together as part of this network over the upcoming years as we continue to train new members and implement this model amongst our schools. If your district is interested in learning more please contact Dawn Moss dmoss@ciul0.org.
